December 2018 Outreach Operation Gratitude

FROM THE DEACONS

A new church year will now begin with Advent. This will be a new year in several ways at FCC. It will start with the traditional Advent season, with a few changes and additions. First on the agenda will, of course, be the Hanging of the Greens on December 1st. Due to the happy quirk of the calendar, this does not fall on the busy weekend following Thanksgiving, which will allow a whole week to recover from Black Friday! Parish Nurse Health Tip

Brush Away Your Health Risks

Poor dental habits can have a surprising ripple effect throughout your body. Grab your toothbrush, some floss and a little extra sink time and you could be on your way to preventing diabetes, cancer, heart disease and more!

Here are some ways keeping your teeth, gums and fresh breath can help you lead a healthier life!

- **Sharper Brain:** People with severe periodontal disease are three times more likely to have Alzheimer's disease, according to a statistical review. In another study, stoke patients had higher levels of a certain bacteria in their saliva, demonstrating a link between oral hygiene and stroke risk.
- Preserves Your Memory: Adults with gingivitis (swollen, bleeding gums) performed worse on tests of memory and other cognitive skills than did those with healthier gums and mouths, according to a report in the Journal of Neurology, Neurosurgery & Psychiatry.
- Clearer Lungs: If you find yourself heading to the hospital, bring your toothbrush. A recent study found that providing patients with oral care decreased instances of hospital-related pneumonia by 39%.
- Lower Cancer Risk: Postmenopausal women who've experienced periodontal disease are at increased risk for breast, esophageal, gallbladder, skin and lung cancers, according to a 2017 study.
- Healthier Kidneys: The correlation between poor periodontal health and atherosclerosis has been well established for a few decades now. Atherosclerosis can be the root of a bunch of health problems you want nothing to do with, like chronic kidney disease.
- Stronger Heart: Endocarditis is an infection or inflammation of the inner lining of the heart chambers and valves, caused by germs invading the bloodstream. While fairly uncommon, it can be fatal. The National Institutes of Health warns that "poor dental hygiene and unhealthy teeth and gums increase your risk for the infection."
- Reduces Risk of Infection and Inflammation: Research has found an association between gum disease and rheumatoid arthritis (RA), an autoimmune disease that causes inflammation of the joints. Experts say the mechanism of the destruction of connective tissues in both gum disease and RA is similar.
- Lower Blood Sugar: People with diabetes and periodontal disease may have a harder time controlling their blood glucose levels.
- Healthy Newborn: Women may experience increased gingivitis during pregnancy. Some research suggests a relationship between gum disease and preterm, low-birth weight infants.
- Lifelong Sex: Men suffering from erectile dysfunction were three times more likely to have been diagnosed with chronic periodontal disease, according to a recent largescale review. Chronic inflammation can damage the lining of blood vessels, including those in the penis.

■ Fatter Wallet: Every time you brush and floss, it's like adding to your 401(k). The average 20-year dental expense for and American 65-plus is about \$15,340. At-home tooth care can help avoid a large chunk of that cost.

How To Keep Those Pearly Whites Sparkly:

- 1. Brush twice a day for 2 minutes each time with a fluoride toothpaste. Please think about buying an electric toothbrush. Brush from multiple angles.
- 2. Don't forget to brush your tongue.
- 3. Floss twice a day.
- 4. Use an antiseptic mouthwash.
- 5. See your dentist twice a year.
- 6. Quit smoking and don't chew tobacco.
- 7. Feel free to chew sugarless gum. Chewing gum is a good way to produce saliva in your mouth. Once saliva starts flowing into your mouth, it neutralizes the acid effect produced by bacteria thereby acting as a natural defender for your teeth.
- 8. Limit acidic drinks like soft drinks and fruit juices.
- 9. Decrease sugary foods.
- 10. If you are prone to gum disease like gingivitis, use an antibacterial toothpaste and mouthwash.
- 11. <u>Use a water pic!</u> (oral irrigator) Here is my testimonial. I floss. Use my electric toothbrush for 2 minutes, swish and spit. And for good measure, I get out my trusty water pic. <u>I am shocked at what the flossing and brushing did not get rid of</u>. I have a tiny bathroom here in Portland to go along with my tiny house, so I was not able to use my regular size water pic with the large tank that I had in my bathroom in Salt Lake. So, I bought a small hand held one on line. Easy to fill. Much smaller, yet powerful! It does the trick! Point being, large or small, I highly recommend using a water pic.


