

# **Temptation: What to Do When We Stumble**



—Paul, *The Bible*, 1 Corinthians 10:12 ~Rev. Doug Gray

Have any of you given up something for Lent this year? Maybe you've "taken up" something? So we are two weeks in and I just want to check in with you. How are you doing? About 10–14 days in is where it often gets harder when we are changing something. The first few days we usually do fine—perhaps we remind ourselves that we have given this up and we go along pretty easily. The next few days are harder, but usually doable—we are still able to exert some control. But by the tenth day... Ah! that's where the temptations really begin!

How do we make it through temptations? And what happens if we stumble?

Think of tempting as testing. In fact, the greek word for temptation in the New Testament is also the word for test, because we are going to find out who we really are. Temptation tests our character, and perhaps are competitive and we love to win when we are tested. The challenge is that when we think like that, we are fasting as an act of will, of ego. A few people may succeed at this, but we are missing the point: the point of "giving up" something is to get closer to God, to learn how to trust God's Presence, guidance, and Providence—to let God become more important to us than what we have given up. If we fast to show how holy we are, or to show how much in control we are, we will fail to find God. For example, if we have given up chocolate for Lent, we hope to learn that God has more sweetness and joy for us than any brownie or Hershey's kiss ever could. When we are put to the test, then, we can remind ourselves that we love God (and God loves us!) more than that thing or that habit. This turns our hearts towards God—and so we pray with thanks for God! And God will provide a way out of that temptation. Paul writes, "No temptation has seized you except what is common to humanity. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it."(1 Corinthians 10:13, NIV)

But perhaps (like me) you have slipped up and broken your fast already. That's where grace comes in! Just be completely honest, and completely open. Confess your failure and own it as yours, and then ask Jesus to forgive you, and believe it is so. God loves you way more than a mistake. What matters to God is you! God's great hope is to have a relationship with you that is deeper than any challenge, because together you can face any challenge and overcome. So God can even use our failures to help us become a more loving, compassionate and forgiving person of God. Let God truly wash away your guilt, so that you can begin again. God does not seem to care how many times we fall, as long as we get up with Him!

May God guide you in this growing season of Lent!

#### From Your Board of Trustees ~ Phil LeHoux

The main action out of the February meeting of the trustees was establishing the parameters for the loan agreement being arranged with All Saints Episcopal Church (ASEC). As has been previously explained, ASEC approached FCC to help secure financing for their planned solar power system to be installed along with a needed roof replacement, which will occur this year. The solar arrays and power storage system will go in later, largely due to the long delivery time associated with some of the power storage and system control equipment. However, ASEC must meet what has become a very tight deadline to apply for a grant from Rocky Mountain Power, which is expected to cover a large part of the solar system costs. That we have the financial flexibility and can assist them in a need when they have been so welcoming and supportive to us is indeed a blessing.

FCC has stepped up to provide a loan of up to \$250,000 to cover some of the initial costs and, just as importantly, ensure the financing required to qualify for the Rocky Mountain Power grant. The loan will be effectively neutral to our overall financing, as it will be at the interest rate the money would otherwise accrue in our current bond fund, from which the funds will be drawn as needed by ASEC to cover their installation costs. It should also be noted that the ASEC fundraising program in progress is doing very well, and it is expected that, between the grants and pledges from members and friends, the loan will likely be fully paid off at the end of the project. Our and ASEC's attorney are currently working out the details of the contract, which is expected to be signed and in place by the end of February, thus meeting ASEC's timetable to proceed.

The Board has also continued to support the program to upgrade the online worship for those remotely attending, as well as enhance the in-person aspects with improved use of audio-visual equipment. When all components are in place, we can expect improvements to the sound system as well as to the visual quality of the online video feed, as well as a simplified streaming management system.

#### March Outreach ~ Becky Bishop

The Outreach Focus for March is Switchpoint. Switchpoint was established in Saint George, Utah in 2014. The two local housing locations are "The Point" Airport Location and Fairpark Location. Switchpoint also operates the 170 beds at West Valley City Overflow site. They also are operating the temporary Tiny Home Project in downtown Salt Lake City, Utah.
